INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Brush a leaf with a light coat of paint.
- 2. Place the leaf painted side down onto a sheet of paper.
- 3. Put another sheet of paper on top.
- 4. Press onto your paper.
- 5. Gently lift the paper and leaf.



6. Repeat until you feel happy with your new artwork!
