



Oil on canvas



Real Name: Unknown

Age: Almost 400 years

Known For:

- Black glasses
- Red sash
- Captain General's baton
- Order of Santiago pendant

The Knight of Santiago's real identity is unknown, but he was likely a government official in Spanish-ruled Naples. He was painted by Spanish artist **Jusepe de Ribera** (1591-1652). As a painter, Ribera excelled at capturing light and shadow.

DID YOU KNOW? The shell-shaped medallion, marked with a red cross, tells us that this man was a member of the prestigious Order of Santiago.
