INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Print** the Surrealist Game sheet(s).
- 2. Fold** the paper in half so there's 1 image on each side.
- 3. Drawer #1** create a drawing including the first image and making into something else.

Don't show your partner!

Make the drawing go over the folded line just a little bit. Then, give your partner the paper so they can't see your drawing.

- 4. Drawer #2** make a drawing including the object on the other side of the paper and connect it to the parts of the first drawing that show over the fold.
- 5. Unfold** the sheet to see how your 2 drawings interact with each other to create a unique, surrealist scene!
